

CHARLES HOLLIDAY BRIDGE

2905 Chautauqua Blvd. Millersport, OH 43046

- · The last covered bridge standing in Walnut Township
- · 96 feet long with a multiple Kingpost truss system
- Reconstructed in 1982 at its current location on the Millersport Lions Club Sweet Corn Festival grounds

GEORGE HUTCHINS BRIDGE

2805 Old Logan Rd. SE Lancaster, OH 43130



- Features multiple Kingpost construction and was built on one of the county's first platted roads
- Reconstructed at Alley Park for the Fairfield County Bicentennial Celebration in 2000



HANAWAY BRIDGE

(AKA HANNAWAY BRIDGE)

7636 Clearport Rd. SW Lancaster, OH 43130

- Has a length of 86 feet and is one of seven bridges that once spanned Clear Creek
- Restored in 1996 and again in 2017, this is one of only four bridges still resting on its original abutments

HARTMAN #2 BRIDGE

5895 Pickerington Rd. NW Carroll, OH 43112



- It features Queenpost trusses and has a 48' length
- The bridge was moved in 1967 to its current location between Ohio & Erie Canal Locks 11 and 12 South in Lockville Park, the site of the longest series of intact canal locks in the state

HIZEY BRIDGE

(private property)

12549 Tollgate Rd. Pickerington, OH 43147

- · Although it can be seen from the road, it is located on private property
- Built by J.W. Buchanan, it originally spanned Poplar Creek and was a popular subject for photographers and artists

JOHN BRIGHT #2 BRIDGE

1570 Granville Pike Lancaster, OH 43130



- Built by Augustus Borneman & Sons, it features a rare reverse bow string truss system
- · Serves as the gateway to Lancaster Festival concerts at Ohio University



JOHNSTON BRIDGE

(AKA JOHNSON BRIDGE)

2260 McDonald Rd. Lancaster, OH 43130

- · It features Howe trusses and double canopies, and is 98 feet long
- · Bridge was sold with an extended warranty
- Spans Clear Creek in its original location and rests on its original abutments

JOHN RAAB BRIDGE

(private property)

5695 Ireland Rd. Lancaster, OH 43130



- · On private property; please obtain permission to explore the bridge
- · Built with a rare Burr Queenpost truss system

MCCLEERY BRIDGE

Arbor Valley Dr. Lancaster, OH 43130

- · Preserved by the Walter family
- · First bridge built by the region's most prolific bridge builder, Jacob Brandt
- · Now spans Fetters Run and is a popular spot on the Lancaster bike path

MINK HOLLOW BRIDGE

2340 Meister Rd. SW Lancaster, OH 43130



- Built by Jacob 'Blue Jeans' Brandt, it rests on its original abutments
- · Roof shows a decided camber (upward curve) in its framework
- Historians petitioned to change its name to: Mink Hollow Covered Bridge over Arney Run in Oil Mill Hollow Near Borcher's Mill



R.F. BAKER BRIDGE

(AKA WINEGARDNER BRIDGE)

6675 Cinci.-Zanes. Rd. NE Lancaster, OH 43130

- · Built by James Arnold and spanned Rush Creek
- In 1981, the bridge was reconstructed behind Fairfield Union School facilities as a special student project
- At 80 feet long, it is one of the county's best examples of a true "kissing bridge"

ROCK MILL BRIDGE

1429 Rockmill Place NW Lancaster, OH 43130



- Rests on its original abutments 30 feet above the Hocking River gorge
- Listed on the National Register of Historic Places, the bridge is next to the fully restored 1824 grist mill Rock Mill
- This is one of the last remaining mill and covered bridge combinations in the nation
- At one time, every U.S. Embassy in the world displayed a photo of Rock Mill Bridge

SHRYER

(AKA SHREYER BRIDGE)
(private property)

4730 Basil-Western Rd. NW Baltimore, OH 43105



- Once located at the entrance of the Fairfield Fish & Game Farm, it was also called the Game Farm Bridge
- Built on a decided skew; the north side extends several feet farther west on the west end, and the south side extends several feet farther east on the east end of the span
- It was reconstructed in 1987, painted barn red, and is easily seen from the road



STEMEN HOUSE BRIDGE (AKA ESTATE BRIDGE)

11892 Woodbridge Lane Baltimore, OH 43105

- Originally 72 feet long, it was shortened to 36 feet during reconstruction because of damage and decay
- · Only covered bridge in the county that is open to vehicular traffic

ZELLER-SMITH BRIDGE

100 Lockville Rd Pickerington, OH 43137



- Moved to Sycamore Creek Park in 1986, it serves as the gateway to the park's arboretum
- During reconstruction, it was changed from a multiple Kingpost with arch truss system to a Queenpost style
